Arrived in Sydney in 1827

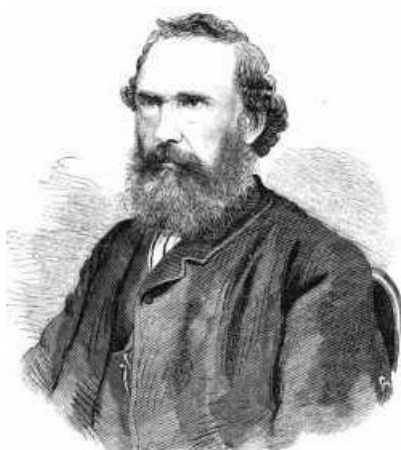
School Teacher & Principal. Owner & Editor of the Bendigo Advertiser 1855 – until his death.

Assembly, the author of the Regulation
of Mines Statue, one the fathers of the
Education Act and the Minister of Mines
under whose administration the Supply of
Water to Sandhurst from Malmesbury was
successfully effected.

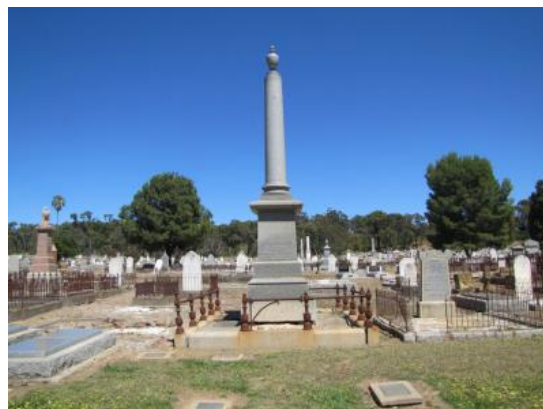
