SUICIDE BY DROWNING.

A widow, named Louisa Zesch, committed suicide early yesterday morning at her residence, near the Carlisle Company's claim, Garden Gully. The woman who was an old and respected resident of the locality, lived with an unmarried daughter.

On Wednesday night Mrs Zesch went to bed about half past nine o'clock. The daughter went to bed in an adjoining room a little afterwards, and did not wake until shortly before seven o'clock yesterday morning. She then went into her mother's room and was surprised at finding the bed unoccupied.

Someone had, however, been asleep, for the clothes were disturbed and the deceased's own clothes were in the room. Miss Zesch on going outside found that some slabs over all underground tank had been removed. There was about ten feet of water in the tank. A neighbour named Carl Schier was then called, and he tried the well with a long pole and a hook, and after searching for some time found the woman's dead body at the edge of the tank. The deceased had only her nightdress on.

The expression of the features was placid. Dr Penfold saw the deceased on Monday last at his surgery. She then complained of pains and sleeplessness. He prescribed for her, but did not think it necessary to advise restraint, as her manner at that time was perfectly calm and rational. The deceased had not threatened either to destroy herself or anyone else. Her manner on Wednesday was cool, and her daughter did not think she would commit suicide. Of late, however, she had been strange in her manner, and she had complained of pains in her head and chest. The deceased was 53 years of age.

At an inquest held yesterday by Mr Strickland the above facts were narrated, and a verdict of suicide from drowning whilst of unsound mind was recorded.
