

Bendigo Cemetery



Notes for the family grave of Augustus Frederick KRONK #9699 in section B6. Augustus Kronk arrived with his father in 1855, and farmed at Terrick Terricks (north of Raywood).

He was a member of Sandhurst Cavalry Troop and given Full Military Funeral. Augustus Kronk was married to Elizabeth Jane (nee: Church) in 1876 (M-935).

Elizabeth Jane died on 8/11/1941 and was buried in section D6.

Both Elizabeth Jane parents, Jane and Robert Joseph Church, are buried in her husband's grave but not named on the headstone.

A Military Funeral.

Yesterday afternoon the mortal remains of the late Mr Augustus Frederick Kronk, who died on the previous day, were interred, with military honours, in the Sandhurst Cemetery. The deceased came to Bendigo with his father about thirty years ago, and has resided here ever since. He was a member of the Sandhurst Cavalry troop. The esteem and respect entertained towards him by all who came in contact with him were shown in the large number of persons who yesterday attended to pay their last tribute of respect to his memory. Mr Kronk was a cousin of Mr Albert Bruhn.

The cortege left the deceased's late residence in Neale Street, Back Creek, shortly before five o'clock. The firing party, consisting of members of the Sandhurst Militia, under the command of Color-Sergeant Toare, led the way, followed by the Militia band, under Bandmaster Northcott. Then came the hearse. After which the

deceased's horse, with boots reversed, was led by two members of the Cavalry. Two mourning coaches were followed by about forty members of the Sandhurst Cavalry troop, dismounted, under the command of Captain Kirby; Lieutenants Tucker and Vickery, and Sergeant Major Darling, drill instructor, being also present. Then came the members of the Loyal James Roe Lodge, M.U.I. O.O.F. with which the deceased was connected, and a long line of cabs and private vehicles.

En route to the cemetery the band rendered the "Dead March in Saul" in their usual masterly style. The beautiful and impressive service of the Church of England was read at the grave by the Rev J Garlick of All Saints', after which the Manchester Unity service was read. The firing party then fired three volleys over the grave. The mortuary arrangements were carried out by Mr T Sayer, undertaker.

The deceased gentleman was the first member of the Cavalry Troop who has died since its reorganization. Notwithstanding that it was not decided until the last moment that he should be buried with military honors, nearly every member of the troop turned out to do honor to the memory of their late comrade.

The deceased young lady, who was 17 years of age, contracted fever three weeks ago and died on Tuesday morning. The funeral, which was largely attended, took place on Wednesday afternoon, the remains being interred in the Bendigo Cemetery, and the Ven Archdeacon MacCullagh officiated at the grave.

Mr T Saver carried out the funeral arrangements.
