DEATH OF MRS G GERMANN.

At 2 o'clock this morning a very old and highly respected resident of Bendigo, in the person of Mrs Germann, wife of Mr G Germann, late manager of the Unity mine, breathed her last at her residence, Webster Street, Ironbark. About a week ago the deceased lady was compelled to take to her bed, owing to an attack of pleurisy, and she gradually sank, and died as stated, the immediate cause of death being heart failure. A family of two son's and a daughter and husband are left to mourn their loss. The sons are the well-known drapers of Pall Mall.

The funeral is appointed to take place tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock to the Bendigo Cemetery.

The Late Mrs Germann.

The funeral of the late Mrs Amelie Germann (wife of Mr Gottlieb Germann), who died on Saturday, took place yesterday. A large number of friends joined in the cortege, which moved from the deceased lady's late residence, "Carlsville" Nettle Street. Over 40 vehicles followed the hearse and two mourning coaches to the Bendigo Cemetery. The service at the grave was impressively conducted by the Rev F Leypoldt.

The remains were enclosed in an elegantly mounted casket of English oak, which was carried to the graveside by Messrs W Scully, J Hill, C Weber, and Grenfell, employees of the Unity mine. Amongst the many citizens present were Crs Ryan and Duniston, Dr H L Atkinson, Messrs I E Dyason, W D C Donovan, B M'Clure, A Roberts, J Pryor, C Perry, R Whiteside, Deehan, M Levy, Bosselmann, Sluytermann, J Dowling, C W Hyett, W Whyte, C Moore, A Biscamp, and Welbgen. There was an abundance of exquisite floral tributes, among them being a beautiful wreath from the employees of Messrs Germann and Germann. The funeral arrangements were satisfactorily carried out by Mr W Farmer.

OBITUARY.

Mr Gottlieb Germann, an old and very highly respected Bendigonian, died at his residence, Webster Street, Ironbark, about 11 o'clock last night. The deceased gentleman arrived in Adelaide in 1851, and a few years later he came to the Bendigo goldfield. For many years he was manager of the Unity Mining Company. He was one of the earliest members of the German Lutheran Church, and for about 20 years ably fulfilled the office of organist.

A man of sterling worth and strict integrity, the deceased gentleman was deservedly held in high esteem by all with whom he came in contact. His wife predeceased him several years ago. Two sons and one daughter survive.
