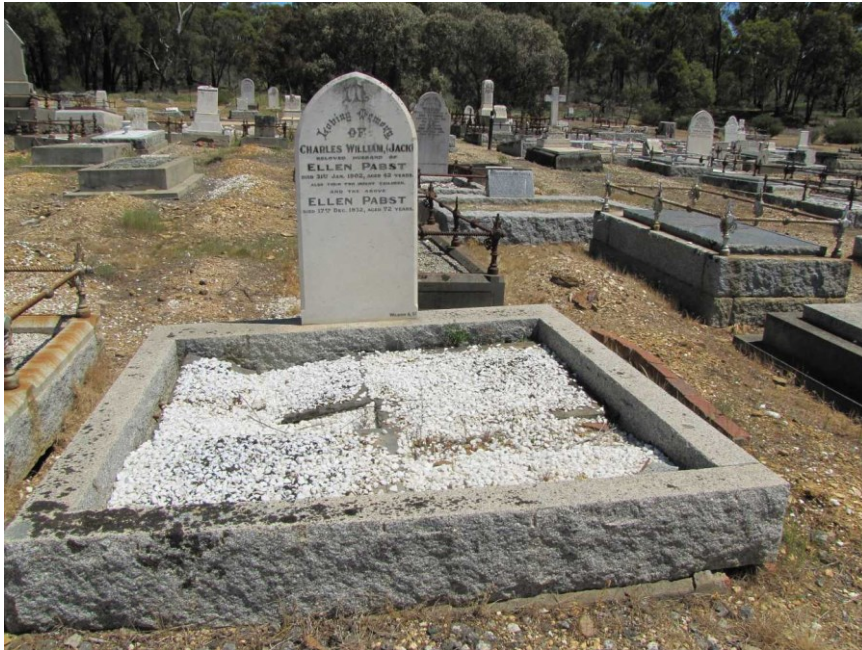

Death of a Cricketer.

Last night there passed away, at his residence, at the corner of Rowan and Honeysuckle streets, Charles Wm Pabst, aged 42 years. Deceased was well known in cricketing circles as "Jack" Pabst, having been connected with local cricket for the past 20 years, during which time he was a member of the old View Point Club, and subsequently of the Bendigo United Club, and latterly of the Long Gully Club. He was a miner by calling, and though a man of splendid physique, he fell a victim to miner's complaint, from which he suffered for 12 months. He leaves a widow and young family. He was held in high esteem by a large circle of friends. The funeral will take place at 3 pm tomorrow.

Funeral.

Yesterday the remains of the late Mr Charles William Pabst, who passed away on Friday evening, were interred in the Bendigo Cemetery, the cortege moving from his late residence, Rowan Street. There was a large attendance of young men, the deceased gentleman having been well known in cricketing circles. The coffin bearers were four members of the Long Gully Cricket Club, of which the deceased was at one time an officer. The service at the grave, which was in the Church of England portion of the cemetery, was conducted by Rev A R Ebbs. The coffin was strewn with a number of choice floral tributes. Mr W Farmer carried out the funeral arrangements.
