**OBITUARY**

The friends of Mrs Pauline Leonhardt, widow of the late Mr Isaac Leonhardt, will be sorry to hear that she succumbed to her recent serious illness on Saturday at the advanced age of 74 years. The deceased lady was about a week ago seized with a paralytic stroke while attending to her domestic duties, and medical aid was at once summoned, but it was of no avail.

The late Mrs Leonhardt, who was of a most kindly demeanour, was highly respected and esteemed. She was a native of Wurtttemburgh, Germany and came to Victoria in the ship Magdalene 54 years ago in 1860. From Melbourne she proceeded direct to White Hills, where she lived for four years, and then removed to Alley Street, Ironbark, where she resided for the last 50 years. Two daughters (Miss Louisa and Miss Pauline Leonhardt) and one son (Mr Carl Leonhardt) survive.

The funeral will take place today at. 11.30 am.
