DEATH OF MR F STREGER.

RESIDENT FOR 61 YEARS.

Mr Friedrich Streger, of King Street, died yesterday at the advanced age of 91 years, 61 of which were spent in Bendigo. The deceased gentleman was born in the town of Wedel, Holstein. He left his native land in 1855, and came to Adelaide, thence to Bendigo. On his way to Bendigo Mr Streger and the other members of his party were held up by bushrangers at Big Hill, and robbed of the money they possessed. Mr Streger met hospitable friends in Mr and Mrs Kahland, who had arrived in Bendigo from Wedel in the year 1853.

In those early days gold digging was carried on almost everywhere in the Bendigo valley, and Mr Streger erected several puddling machines in localities which are now known as King Street, Garsed Street, Myrtle Street, and Quarry Hill. At that time the latter place was called Red Hill. The prospectors were fairly successful.

The late Mr Streger was a carpenter and builder by trade, and followed that occupation for many years after his gold digging exploits. He was a partner in Bonati's rich claim at New Chum, and he invested largely in mining. Mr Streger married the widow of the late Mr Kahland senr, and he spent his declining years with Mr J Kahland in King Street.

The funeral of the late Mr Johann C F Streger took place yesterday to the Bendigo Cemetery, and was attended by a large number of friends. The coffin bearers were Messrs G Pieper, A Swalling, J Micheel, F Barth, D Bosselmann, and A Meurer.

The pall-bearers were Dr A Sandner, A Sticlmann, H Wells, W Scheuffele, A Meurer, and N Albert. A large collection of floral tributes was received. The Rev Pastor Leypoldt held a brief service at the house, and also officiated at the grave. The chief mourners were Messrs J and D Kahland, Mrs J Kahland, Mrs Fraatz, Messrs G Kahland, F Fraatz, J Fly, H Newman and H Wells. Mr W H Oakley supervised the funeral arrangements.
