Miss Kitty Murray, 21 years of age, an adopted daughter of Mrs Gillman, licensee of the Rising Sun hotel, died in the hospital yesterday from typhoid fever. She was highly accomplished, and was well liked by all her acquaintances. The funeral will take place to the Kangaroo Flat Cemetery tomorrow.

OBITUARY

The death of a very old identity of the Bendigo district occurred on Thursday evening, when Mr W Gillman, of Barnard Street, expired at the advanced age of 74 years. The deceased gentleman had suffered for the past five years from eczema, but it was only some four months back that he was forced to keep to his bed, Drs

Hinchcliff and Fullerton being in constant attendance. The late Mr Gillman had resided in Victoria for 48 years, and was a native of Hadley, ESSEX, England. For some 20 years he lived at Kangaroo Flat, where he followed mining pursuits, being manager of the old Bird's Reef Company for a considerable period. He then removed to Bendigo, and for some years kept the Cumberland hotel, Lyttleton Terrace, and the Temple Court hotel, Pall Mall.

After leaving the latter, Mr and Mrs Gillman resided privately for some two years, and then Mrs Gillman obtained the license of the Rising Sun hotel, Barnard Street, where they have since resided. The deceased gentleman was well known in mining circles, being a large investor. He was highly respected, and a very large number of old residents attended the funeral, which took place yesterday. The remains were interred in the Church of England portion of the Kangaroo Flat Cemetery, and the members of the Loyal Heart of Friendship Lodge, of which the deceased gentleman was a member for many years, marched beside the hearse. The coffin was borne to the grave by Messrs J Guy, W Guy, J Patterson and Fitzpatrick. Dean MacCullagh read the burial service.
