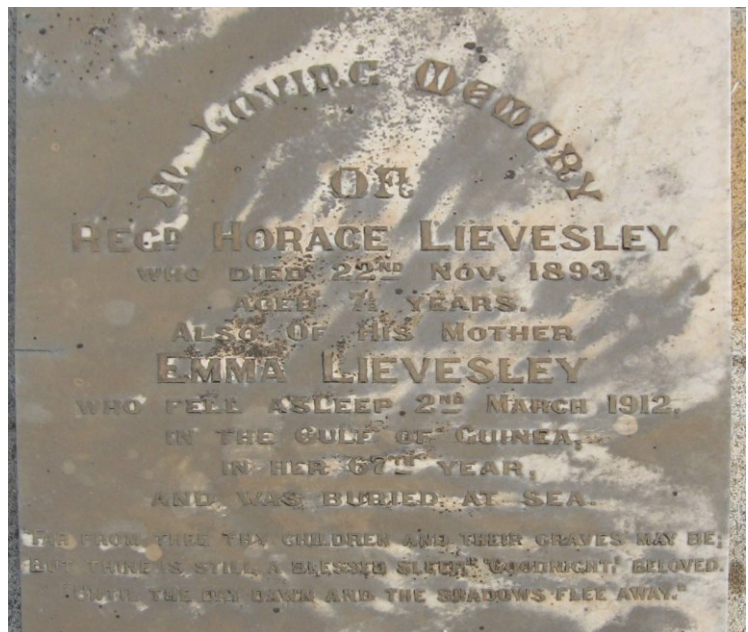


The grave for Reginald Horace Lievesley who died in 1893 aged 7½

Death from Blood Poisoning.

A fine little boy, the son of Mr W Lievesley, head teacher of the Kangaroo Flat State School, who resides at Horace Street, Quarry Hill, died on Wednesday afternoon from the effects of blood poisoning, caused, it is supposed, by the bite of an insect of some kind.

The little fellow, who was seven years of age, went to St Paul's Sunday School picnic at Ravenswood on the 15th inst. and on his return home it was noticed he had a swelling under his right eye. Nothing serious was then anticipated, but a couple of days later the swelling became more pronounced, and the boy becoming very ill Dr. Hugh Boyd was sent for.

It was then found that blood poisoning had developed and in spite of the efforts of Dr Boyd and Dr Atkinson, who had been called in in consultation, the little sufferer became worse and after experiencing great pain succumbed on Wednesday afternoon.

Much sympathy has been expressed for Mr and Mrs Lievesley in their sad bereavement, and the funeral, which took place yesterday morning, was largely attended.
