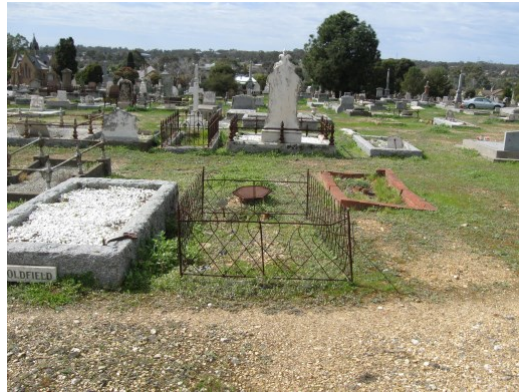


Bendigo Cemetery



Notes for Edwin & Abigail Collcutt Grave #14068 in section D6.  
Edwin was a storekeeper in the old Oxford shop in Williamson Street, and was  
later a cabman.

Their grave has a unique wire fence and rusted iron shield, but no headstone.

Edwin died in 27/08/1896 in section D6 grave #14068.

He was married to Abby who was buried in 5/03/1903.

Sudden Death.

A cabman named Edwin Collcutt, who resides off Neale Street, Back Creek, drove home from Strathfieldsaye last evening, and on going into his house sat down on a chair and fell back dead. Dr Atkinson was called in, but his services were of no avail. The deceased, who was a native of Oxford, England, arrived in the colony from California, and came on to Bendigo in 1855. For a long time he kept the old Oxford store in Williamson Street. He was 69 years of age. His sister, the late Mrs Keck, of Quarry Hill, died about a fortnight ago.

Magisterial Inquiry.

Yesterday afternoon Mr W Webb JP, held a magisterial inquiry concerning the death of Mr Edwin Collcutt, a resident of Neale Street, Back Creek, a cabman, who died suddenly on the previous evening. Constable Hancock was present on behalf of the police. Evidence detailing the circumstances under which death occurred was given by Mrs Collcutt (the widow), and, Dr Hinchcliff, who had made a post mortem examination of the body, deposed that the cause of death was syncope from failure of the heart's action.

At this stage the inquiry was adjourned until eight o'clock in the evening to permit of the attendance of Mr E T Harrison, plasterer, a neighbour, who had been called in to attend deceased just prior to his death. After hearing the evidence, the deputy coroner recorded a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony.
