

1 John Betham M. R.C.S.E. a pioneer doctor. He died 11/03/1870 aged 42. E4 grave #1392.

2 John Wolstencroft Brickmaker. A family business with his brother William. John died 5/03/1922 aged 87. E4 grave #2747.

3 Elizabeth Jane Rundle died in 1861 aged 1 year 9 months. An early sandstone headstone with A.D. Near two other family graves. D4 grave #3755.

4 Section D4 - All the grave mounds in this area have been levelled. Distinctive and identifying features have been obliterated. D4

5 Heinrich Bockelmann family grave. He died 1905 aged 75 years. Musical family with music note inscribed on headstone. B4 grave #3343.

6 Charles INGLEBY died 16/01/1864 aged 23. Old sandstone headstone. B4 grave #1631.

7 John Brewin White, noted bushman and cattleman. Died 26/07/1864 aged 42. B4 grave #1820.

8 George Aspinall died 18/05/1883 aged 52 years. Was a butcher when he first came to the goldfields in 1853. Twice Mayor. There is a good row of immortelles on this headstone. A3 grave #8753.

9 Joel Horwood died 4/05/1900 aged 68 years. An Ironfounder and a prominent figure in the commercial world. A2 grave #5180.

10 James Montgomery (1804-1875). A Solicitor, he was a very early colonist who died 23/04/1875 aged 70. A2 grave #5629.

11 Richard Williamson. Businessman and mining director and owner of some property including the Hopetoun Hotel. Died 1/11/1909 aged 73 years. B2 grave #6348.

12 George Henry Hobson died 11/02/1897 aged 39 years. Masonic and Oddfellow member and member of Council. B1 grave #9059.

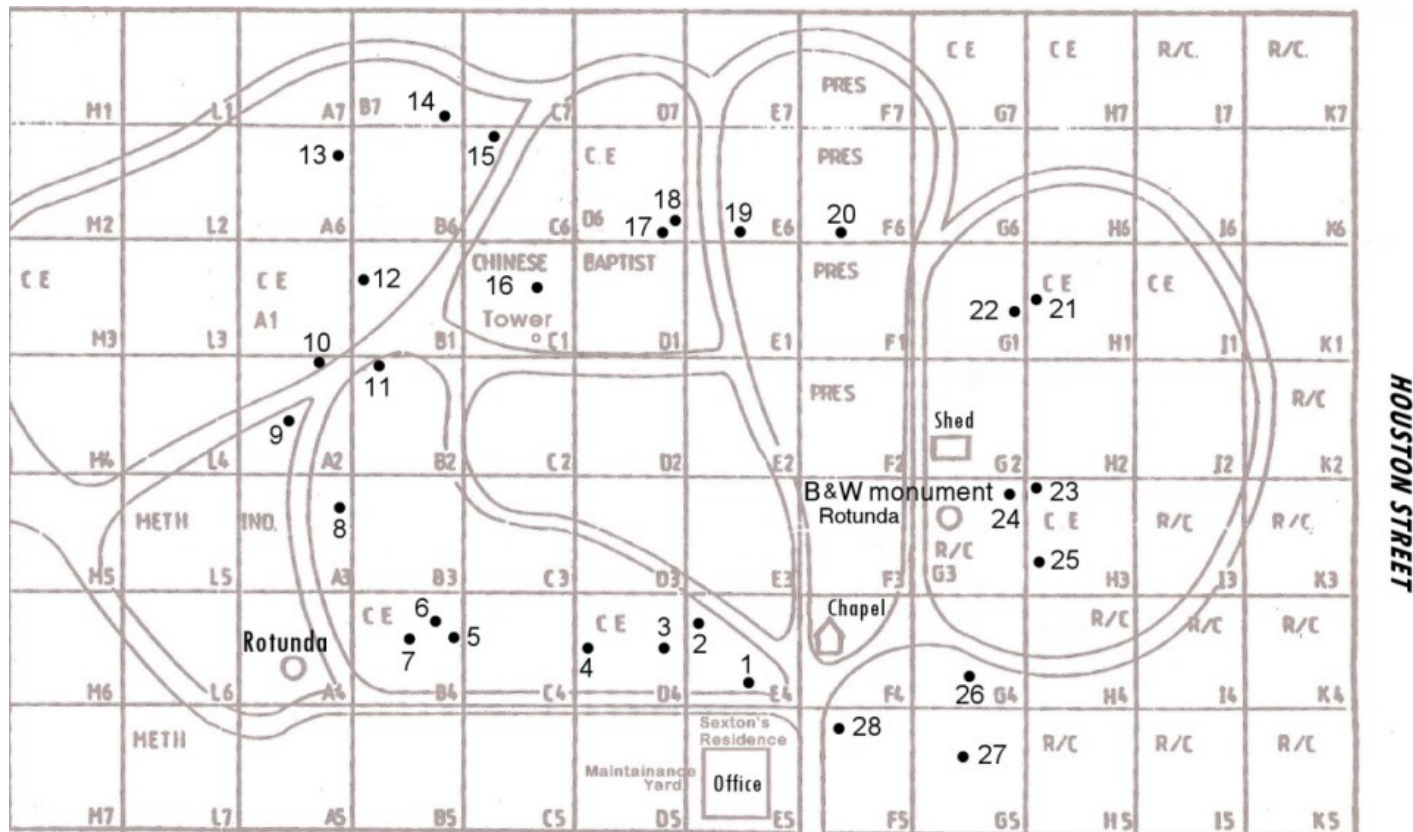
13 John Stevens Clasp hands headstone. Former miner. Died 29/05/1907 aged 62 years. A6 grave #8578.

14 James Northcott Died 18/12/1904 aged 67. The main manager to George Lansell's mine, James was most famously known for being bandmaster to Northcott's City Band. B7 grave #18091.

15 Robert Ross Havefield. Died 20/04/1889 aged 70 years. He was grazier, drover, miner, newspaper proprietor, editor and writer. Founder Bendigo Advertiser. C6 grave #11060.

16 Chinese Section C1 Footstones, not headstones. C1.

17 Reginald Horace Lievesley. Words on headstone for his memorial and his mother who was buried at sea. D6 grave #12838.

18 William Henry Jones - was found drowned in a dam in Quarry Hill, November 1893 aged 84. His grave has a unique wire fence and rusted iron shield, but no headstone. Buried in D6 grave #12824.

19 James Sprunt Andrew. He was a JP and auctioneer. He died in Scotland and his body brought back to Australia for burial in Bendigo. Buried in E6 grave #18069.

20 Frederick Benjamin Pardon. This grave has 6 vault rings. F6 grave #26294.

21 Sir John Quick (1852 - 1932). He was a leading Australian politician, active freemason and lawyer, and sometimes called Founder of Federation. H1 grave #29185.

22 Henry Archdall Langley 1st Anglican Bishop of Bendigo. G1 grave #18963.

23 Harry Holmes - well known pastoralist at Elmore & Mayor of Bendigo and 1st husband to Amy. Also Douglas and Amy Bayne - well known benefactors of many Bendigo institutions. H3 grave #23517.

24 Burke and Wills Memorial. G3.

25 Catholic Bishops and Nuns of Bendigo. Section G4.

26 Sylvester Francis Cahill. Tragic deaths occurred during Royal visit in 1867. Three boys burnt to death. G4 grave #2885.

27 Section G5 is an old Irish Catholic area.

28 Thomas Joseph Oakley. Early undertaker at Bendigo from 1853. Died 16/12/1885 aged 76. F5 grave #3211.

DISCOVER BENDIGO CEMETERY

This is a walking tour along old paths which used to be asphalted and well-kept years ago. Each path was marked with a lane pointer named after a Colonial garden flower. We hope you will look around and spend time wandering between the graves, while reading names and inscriptions as you go along.

Notice the different styles of lettering, the varied colours and textures of the tombstones, plus the weathering effects. There are many different styles of monumental works as you walk through the segregated religious areas, often with the mason's name on the bottom right hand corner. Observe the great variety of iron lace work, fences, and wire frames. Symbolism is used extensively on tombstones, look for urns, draped shawls, flowers, palms, hands, crosses, anchors, doves and angels.

Many of the old trees have been cut down. Note the stumps of the 130 year old cedar trees that once lined the roads. The few lone palm trees give you an idea of the former avenues of palms.

The Mortuary Chapel, front gates, stone fence, hitching posts, 2 rotundas and the Chinese funeral chimney are listed with the City Greater Bendigo and Heritage Victoria.

Various styles of burial number plates are raised all over the cemetery. These were produced by local foundries and sold by the Cemetery office to relatives. Several of these burial plates may be found on a grave as they are burial numbers not grave plot numbers.

Notice the extent of vandalism, almost every glass cover to the porcelain 'immortelles' has been broken. Many tombstones have been purposely rocked to tip them over, whilst the metal burial numbers have been used as destructive weapons.

All tombstones are owned in perpetuity and must be maintained by families. This is not the responsibility of cemetery trusts.

We hope you have enjoyed your walk through the Bendigo Cemetery and will come back often to discover more.

To this end a gold coin donation is welcome.

Information and help in locating grave sites and burials is available from the volunteers manning the Sexton's Residence near the front gates when open, while the main cemetery office is at Eaglehawk and is open during business hours. The **Bendigo Family History Group** is located at the Bendigo Library and the **Bendigo Historical Society** at the Specimen Cottage in Hargreaves Street. Both have good information on graves, families obituaries and other local histories.
